Conditions to be imposed on the grant of a permit

Behaviour

When fishing, all anglers are to behave in a manner that will not offend passers-by or residents.

Bankside

No night fishing. Daylight ends half an hour after sunset. For a night fishing permit contact the Cultural and Community Development Team.

A maximum of two rods may be used at any one time.

No surface bait allowed. No blood worm to be used. No nut baits allowed.

No littler, shot, hooks, nylon or other line to be left on the banks.

No camping. Brolly camps may be used. No fires to be lit. No radios or TVs to be played.

No lead shot to be used including lead above seven plummets and ledger weights up to one ounce inclusive.

All hooks must be barbless. These will be checked regularly. Pikeing, semi barbless hooks, wire trace to be used 18" minimum.

All fish to be returned to the water alive. No Carp to be kept in keep nets unless during matches.

Live bait for Pike fishing must not be brought to the water, but caught from the water.

All anglers must have assembled landing nets and disgorgers. No baited lines are to be left unattended in the water at any time.

General

A National Rivers Authority Rod and Line Licence is required to fish. These are obtainable from the Environment Agency. Licences must be carried when fishing.

No rods to be left unattended.

Anglers not complying with the conditions set out above may be required to cease fishing and shall vacate the Lake shore at the request of the Council's appointed bailiffs or any officer of the Council.

For you own safety:

Tetanus

Anglers are advised to ensure that they have an up-to-date Tetanus injection.

Weil's Disease

Although there are no known rat problems around the lake, all users are advised that rats can carry Weil's Disease. This infection can get into the body through cuts and scratches and through the lining of the mouth, throat and eyes. The symptoms begin with a flu-like illness with a persistent and severe headache.

For your protection against this and other possible diseases:

- Cover all cuts etc. with a suitable waterproof dressing.
- Do not go into the water if you have a skin condition.
- Do not swallow the water.
- Wash your hands thoroughly before eating

If at any time you are worried about your health, contact your GP as soon as possible.
