COMPULSORY PURCHASE ORDER UPDATE

A Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) is an important tool widely used by councils to help deliver social, environmental and economic change.

The council made an order in October 2020, which is yet to be confirmed by Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government. If confirmed, the order will give the council the legal right to obtain any remaining land or property interests within the Sheerwater regeneration area without the consent of the owner.

When an order is made, those affected have the right to object and a public local inquiry is held. Because all qualifying objections to the Sheerwater CPO (five in total) were withdrawn, the virtual inquiry due to take place in June was cancelled. The Inspector is instead conducting the inquiry via the written representations procedure and will put forward his or her recommendations as to whether or not the Secretary of State should confirm the CPO (with or without changes – called modifications), or reject it.

Cllr Debbie Harlow, Lead Member for the Sheerwater Regeneration Project, said: “The council needs to have compulsory purchase powers for this project to ensure it can deliver all of the new homes and community infrastructure promised.

“The agreement at Full Council to make the order was however, based on only using these powers as a last resort. And I’m pleased to say that so far, we’ve been able to secure nearly all of the required land interests via mutual agreement. This is quite unusual and it’s the product of a lot of hard work by council officers. It also shows how willing and prepared we are to support those impacted by the regeneration process.”

Purple phase: new homes available now


A medium rise development incorporating Murray Green, 10 three-storey town houses and 82 one, two and three bedroom apartments.

This first residential phase is now complete and all of the contemporary new build homes within Fairfax Place and Murray Place are ready for occupation, along with the 10 three-storey townhouses.

Whether for private or affordable rent, the size, quality and quantity of homes are all identical. They have been designed to give residents a modern spacious home filled with integrated appliances and quality finishes throughout. The floor to ceiling windows and doors let in the maximum amount of natural daylight and fresh air, and every home has its own private balcony or terrace for relaxation and connection to the outside world.

The apartments and townhouses which are available on the open market for private rent are being advertised now at **fairfaxplace.canalsidewoking.co.uk**, where you can also find out more about the mod cons that come as standard, and optional add-ons such as allocated parking and superfast broadband.

Homes which are available for affordable rent will be advertised via the council's choice based lettings (CBL) system. To register your housing need, browse and bid on available properties, go to **woking.gov.uk/cbl** or speak to a member of the Sheerwater Regeneration Housing Support Team who can also arrange viewings of any available properties that fit your housing requirements.



In recent weeks the Gilbert-Ash landscaping team has shovelled 220 tonnes of peat-free compost, spread two tonnes of bark mulch and planted around 1,500 shrubs and perennials to create the private podium garden at the centre of the new development.






Eastwood Leisure Centre: opens to the public in October 2021




Red phase: Demolition works underway

A medium rise development delivering a sheltered housing block, an attractive mews street, a line of mixed-use maisonettes and a six-storey mixed-use apartment building overlooking a central square.

Ground clearance works continue and all of the existing properties have now been demolished. In the coming weeks, Gilbert-Ash will start drainage works and the foundations for the new building structures will be poured.

At some point in the future, it will be necessary to close Dartmouth Avenue for up to four weeks to raise the surface level of the road. Residents will be given advance notice and a diversion route will be created. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout allowing residents to continue using the shops and other services located along Dartmouth Avenue.
