Driving forward the Woking Integrated Transport Project

April 2018

Welcome to the April update of highway project works in Woking Town Centre.

Albion Square Plaza

A substantial amount of excavation work has taken place over the last few weeks to remove the large concrete planters and former surface. The pouring of concrete into the excavated area next to Albion House, to lay the foundations up to the temporary bus lane, is now underway.

In the summer, the new plaza will open in two parts. The new bus and cycle contraflow lane, running alongside the station entrance, will be the first section open. The remaining, larger section, from the bus lane to Albion House, will follow.

New Town Quay bus stop

A new bus shelter has been installed, located by Bedser Bridge on Victoria Way adjacent to WWF Living Planet Centre and the Basingstoke Canal.

The bus stop will be available for passengers to use when work to the new supporting bus lane is completed in July.

Next six weeks

There are a number of short term day and night closures scheduled for Victoria Way from Lockfield Road to Chobham Road, to help facilitate the completion of the new bus lane.



Town Quay bus stop opening soon

Paving enhancement works on Chapel Street are due to start and will take around ten weeks. The paving work to Church Path has been put back to late June 2018 to maintain vital access to the station.

The central reservation hedge along Victoria Way adjacent to the Lightbox Gallery has been removed to allow for upgrades to utility systems. The hedges will be replaced with green vegetation in due course.

- Surrey Disabled People's Bus Pass
- Surrey Student Fare Card
- 16-25 Railcard
- Rail Season Ticket Photocard
- A Local Elector Card (see below)
