**THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL
HIGH STREET (C143) WOKING (CONTRA-FLOW CYCLE LANE)
ORDER 2020**

ON 15 JANUARY 2020 SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL MADE the above named Traffic Regulation Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”). The effect of the Order will be to (i) prohibit all vehicles, except pedal cycles, from being in the cycle lane specified in the Schedule to this Notice at any time; and (ii) provide that all pedal cycles proceeding in the said cycle lane shall do so in a north-easterly direction.

The prohibition referred to above will not apply in relation to (a) A vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; (b) Anything done upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform; (c) Any person driving any mechanical road cleansing vehicle provided that such vehicle is only being used between the hours of 5.30 a. m. and 7.00 a. m. inclusive throughout the week; (d) Any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to Section 66 or 67 of the Act; (e) A vehicle insofar as is necessary in order to gain access to or leaving (i) an authorised parking place or loading bay adjacent to the cycle lane; (ii) any land and/or premises abutting or accessible only from the lengths of road specified in the cycle lane; or (iii) any other road at its junction with High Street (C143) Woking.

A copy of the made Order, which will come into operation on 19 January 2020, together with plans showing the lengths of road to which the Order relates and a Statement of the Council’s reasons for making the Order, may be inspected free of charge at (a) Woking Borough Council, Civic Offices, Gloucester Square, Woking, Surrey, Mondays to Fridays 9:00am to 4.45pm; (b) Surrey County Council (Reception), Quadrant Court, 35 Guildford Road, Woking GU22 7QQ. Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm; and (c) Woking Library. Gloucester Walk, Woking, GU21 6EP, Monday to Saturday, during normal opening hours.

If you wish to object to the Order, or any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of the date of the making of the Order, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE - That length of High Street (C143) Woking, as extends from its junction with Church Path to a point 30 metres west of the western property boundary of No. 28 High Street extending between the north-western edge of the carriageway, and a continuous white line 1.5 metres south east thereof broken by gaps opposite and adjacent to the junction with Chapel Street or any lay-by containing an authorised parking place or loading bay.
